
General objectives

The cycle of the summer school










Mario Calderini, a Ph.D. in Economics from the University of Manchester, is full Professor at Politecnico di Milano, School of Management, where he teaches Social Innovation. He is the Director of Tiresia, the Politecnico di Milano School of Management's Research Centre for Impact Finance and Innovation. He is cabinet advisor to the Minister of Innovation Vittorio Colao and a member of the Sustainable Finance for Infrastructure Advisory Board established by Minister Enrico Giovannini. He has been the Director of Alta Scuola Politecnica and Executive Vice President of Fondazione Politecnico. He served as senior advisor to several Ministers of University Research and Innovation and Government's Sherpa for the G7 Italian Presidency 2017.

His numerous publications in highly ranked international journals cover several topics in the field of innovation and social impact finance. He has been a member of the G8 Task Force for Social Impact Investment; he chaired the Italian Advisory Board on Social Impact Finance; he is the President of the Scientific Committee of the Social Impact Agenda for Italy Association (Italy's NAB). He sits in the Italian Government's Advisory Group on Social Entrepreneurship and Impact Measurement and he contributed to promote the social innovation agenda in Italy, launching the sector's first public consultation. He has been part of the Government's Advisory Group that drafted the new law on social entrepreneurship.


He is the President of the Advisory Board for Research and Innovation Strategy of the Lombardy Region Government. He sits in the Advisory Board of Unicredit Group, in the Sustainability Advisory Board of Bolton Group and Edison, and in the Directors Board of Fondazione De Agostini. Board of the newly established Nesta Italy Foundation.





Andrea Piccaluga is the Director of the Institute of Management at Scuola Superiore Sant'Anna. He is vice-President of Netval (www.netval.it), the Italian network of University Technology Transfer Offices, after being president from 2014 to 2019. He holds a PhD from Scuola Superiore Sant'Anna and a Master in Technology and Innovation Management from SPRU-University of Sussex. He is Associate editor of the R&D Management Journal, member of the Board of the Italian Society of Management (SIMA) and Fondazione Casa Cardinale Maffi. He collaborates with large and medium-sized companies (Knauf, Loccioni, ENI, ENEL, Valagro, etc.), with the European Patent Office (EPO) and the Italian Patent Office (UIBM) and with the Ministry of University and Research (MUR), JRC Bruxelles and with the regional governments of Puglia (Arti), Tuscany and Emilia Romagna.


He has published articles about R&D management, Open Innovation, Regional Innovation Policies, hightech entrepreneurship and Technology Transfer. In the last few years he has been increasingly active in the field of purpose-driven organisations. He is co-author of La Buona Impresa (II Sole 24 Ore), La sfida del trasferimento tecnologico. Le università italiane si raccontano (Springer, with M. Bianchi), La gestione del trasferimento tecnologico (Springer, with G. Conti and M. Granieri) and Sorella Economia (Porziuncola, with M. Asselle).





Riccardo Fini is Associate Professor and Coordinator of the PhD Program in Management at the University of Bologna (UniBo) and Visiting Professor at Imperial College London (ICL) and Nord Business School Bode. He serves as Director of the Entrepreneurship Hub and of the Master in Entrepreneurship at Bologna Business School. His research interests include entrepreneurship, science commercialization and impact. He researched at Mines Paris, Case Western Cleveland, U. Bozen and ICL. He is a two-time recipient of the EU Marie Curie fellowship and a one-time recipient of the IT IRI Management Fellowship.

His work is published in the Academy of Management Journal, Entrepreneurship Theory & Practice (ET&P), Journal of Business Venturing (JBV), Journal of Management Studies (JMS), Organization Science, Research Policy, and Strategic Entrepreneurship Journal. As principal investigator he has been awarded €400.000, and he's serving as Associate Editor for the Journal of Technology Transfer. He is on the Editorial Board of ET&P, JBV and JMS, and has been appointed to the Membership Committee of the Entrepreneurship Division at the Academy of Management. His research was featured in II Sole24Ore, Nature, Times Higher Education and The New York Times.





She has published 15 books and more than 170 papers and chapters in a wide variety of journals and books. Her latest books are Transforming towards Life-Centered Economics (2020) and Management and the Sustainability Paradox (David Wasieleski, Sandra Waddock, and Paul Shrivastava, 2020). Current research interests are intellectual shamanism, transformational systems change, memes and narratives in system transformation, stewardship of the future, corporate sustainability and responsibility, the problem of growth, and wisdom.
